Bio and Filmography

Anthropologist **Dr. Niobe Thompson** is a Canadian filmmaker and science host, well known around the world for his engaging and adventurous on-screen presence. An experienced Producer and Director, Canada's *Globe & Mail* calls his unique approach to science storytelling "indescribable, but brilliant."

Niobe's work as a Director and Producer has been awarded Canada's highest honour for science and nature documentaries at the Canadian Screen Awards three times and he has twice won "Best Human and Social Sciences" at the Jackson Hole Science Media Awards. His 2019 miniseries *Equus - Story of the Horse* received more national screen awards than any other Canadian documentary of its year.

After winning a Special Jury Award at the 2019 Sundance Film Festival for the short film Fast Horse, Niobe received his second Emmy nomination for his documentary on transplant medicine, Transplanting Hope. This was the first film in history to capture on screen the death of a patient and the decision of his family to donate his organs, and it helped transform Canada's organ donation rate.

Niobe is the founder of the boutique production company Handful of Films. After coproducing and co-directing the Canadian-Australian feature documentary *Carbon - An Unauthorized Biography*, he is now making a feature documentary about ancient DNA called *Before the Ice* with Tangled Bank Studios for PBS NOVA and ZDF Terra X and a one-hour documentary about a neurodiverse paleontologist called *Frozen in Time* for CBC "The Nature of Things".

2024 *Frozen in Time*, Producer & Director for an hour-long documentary for CBC's "The Nature of Things" following the long journey of a leading Canadian paleontologist to overcome brain injury and return to science.

2024 *Before the Ice,* Producer & Director of a feature-length first-ever journey into the living world before the Ice Age, using ancient DNA, with Tangled Bank Studios for PBS NOVA, ZDF, DR, and SVT.

2024 *Animal Pride*, Executive Producer of an hour-long exploration of queer behaviour in the animal kingdom, for for CBC's "The Nature of Things".

- **2022** *Carbon The Unauthorized Biography*, Co-Producer & Co-Director of a feature-length exploration of the nature's most consequential element, a story told in her own words, for CBC, ABC, and ARTE.

- **2020** *The Long Today*, Director and Producer. A short documentary, exploring the bond between father and son against a backdrop of four decades of wilderness canoe tripping. Premiered at the Banff Mountain Film Festival and selected for the Banff World Tour 2021.
- **2018** *Equus The Story of the Horse*, Producer, Director, Host. A three-part documentary series exploring the extraordinary influence of horses on human history. Season launch for CBC's The Nature of Things; 2019 broadcasts on PBS "Nature" and "NOVA", ZDF "Terra X", Arte and DR.
